







Features and Cues

- ✓ Raise the mid-tongue up near the roof of the mouth and hold.
- ✓ Voice is turned ON for Y.

Need More Help?

Sequence "ee" and "ah" vowels to shape a Y (e.g. "eeyaah").

Common Errors

- x /w/
- × /I/

Classroom Strategies

- Model correct speech in response to some of the student's errors. Use emphasis and point to your mouth to highlight the corrected sound ("What did you do <u>yesterday?"</u>).
- 2. Point out the different sounds in print (e.g. "Look, 'young' has your practice sound.").
- **3.** Create a small list of functional, key words for you and your student to practice together in their classroom routines. Write the words on a cue card or sticky note as a reminder.
 - a. Can you think of any words that you use in your daily lessons that contain Y?
 - b. Does the student have a classmate whose name contains Y?
 - c. Are there any weekly vocabulary or spelling words that contain Y?
- **4.** Offer choices for correct responding to discussion questions (e.g. "Is the school bus 'lellow' or 'yellow'?"). Place emphasis on the correct sound.
- **5.** Remember to acknowledge the student's attempts to communicate. Show interest in what they are saying and give them extra time to respond, as needed.
